Reaching the People of New Jersey at the Passaic County State Fair

August 12-15, 2021 the annual Passaic County State Fair offered a wonderful diversion for families after two years of lockdown and social distancing. The fair is an annual event that takes place in late summer. Each year the fair brings rides, a variety of vendors, and fireworks to the area. Smiles are not lacking on the faces of children as they walk through the fair grounds. Surprisingly, thousands of people attended the fair this year despite the Covid environment.

Matthew 9:38 Ministries joined the many vendors on site, offering prayer and sharing the Gospel. Prayer was spoken in Spanish as well as English to serve the heavy Spanish-speaking population in the area. Saturate USA provided plenty of materials for adults and children for the crowd to take home. Saturate's materials complemented Matthew 9:38's efforts and opened the door for several conversations about Jesus Christ. The Gideons were located next to Matthew 9:38's tent. They provided English and Spanish-speaking Bibles. People gladly received the materials; the gospel message, and prayer. Many seeds were sown.

"It was incredible to discover that a few families and individuals had never heard the Gospel," explained Sonya. Carlos shared the gospel and prayed powerfully during the fair. The team experienced the power of God moving. Two college-age women gave their lives to Jesus. We met and witnessed to several people from other religions: Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu, Atheist, and others.

Early afternoon on September 18, 2021, a team went to a local mall to share the gospel. They met and spoke with people sitting in common areas and in the food court. The mall was crowded with people. The team approached many tables and spoke with several people who asked many questions about God. Some challenged the faith, others received the message, and some spoke of their Christian walk. The team distributed tracts and booklets called: The Case for Christ. The Case for a Creator. God's Love, and Follow Me.

During the outreach the team saw the great need of harvest workers. "There were too many people. We could only reach a small portion," one woman said. They prayed for the Lord to send more workers. The number of lost is very great. Believers should leave their comfort zones and reach out to the lost. Many are hurting, blind and hopeless. Believers have the truth which sets people free. A retired missionary shared an incident when he was newly married, his wife pregnant and sick with something that the doctors recommended a treatment for that might leave the baby severely handicapped. He recommended that they abort the baby. As the father to be was crying out to God in this crisis, God replied that this new dad-to-be was looking at this from the point of view of his culture and that culture required that the pregnancy be normal, the birth normal and the baby born with all the potential for a healthy and prosperous life. That was not the way God looked at it. He was giving them a baby to love! They should receive the baby as God's gift to them. This encounter changed their way of thinking and they proceeded to prepare for the birth, preparing a room, decorating it, ready to receive the baby. The baby turned out to be completely normal, a girl, and the treatment of the mom-to-be worked also. I thought that the "God-culture of love" applied in so may situations, so many encounters. That is what I would like people to feel in our encounters: God's love through us.

with food, shelter, clothing, family matters and so forth. Evangelism and outreach should be common. However, today many churches are inward focused. For some, evangelism is a negative connotation. How can this be?

"We are living in a very dark time. It is also one of the most opportunistic times to expand reach to people in the surrounding communities," states Sonya. She emphasizes that Christians have the word of God which is truth that can change lives and the world. Sharing is one of the most loving things you can do.

There are some people who will not go to a church if they are not engaged. Experience has proven over the years that some people who have had a door-to-door encounter seek out a church with which they can join join and learn about God. A member of Montclair Community Church in Montclair, NJ said, "When our church called visitors to stand for a welcome greeting, we asked how they learned about our church, and we were told, 'Someone came to our door.' " She continued to state that they heard those words several times. Community outreach does work. As Jesus healed the sick, cast out demons, raised the dead and taught in synagogues and in marketplaces; so should we. Jesus was compelled by love for people. It is love that should compel us to go out into the surrounding communities, to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.
